Potty Training

The New Year may bring many ideas of change and things you may personally want to conquer with your child. If potty training is one of these please do have read of the updated guidance

We encourage, across all the age groups, child involvement in toileting dependant on their stage of development this is different for all.

Nappies or pull ups – at the end of the day the choice and cost is yours. If your child is not potty training and wears pull ups they have to be stripped to only having their socks on when changed. We would therefore recommend for their own comfort, especially now as we go into the coldest part of winter that they wear a nappy.

If they are toilet training loose elasticated clothing is preferable, if you've every been desperate for the loo and got tight clothing on with a button that won't undo you'll know what we mean and why !

Do talk to us if you are ready to take on the challenge of toilet training and we can then loan you our toilet training bag which includes toileting stories and advice.

Last term we added toileting support to Tapestry care diary. – this records changing times and staff undertaking this. From January we will also be recording poo type. <https://eric.org.uk/poo-checker/>

Struggling with your child ? – Behaviours challenging you?
